PROMOTING PROTECTIVE FACTORS

The SFG Initiative is designed to influence communication about and the incorporation of Protective Factors throughout partners' internal work and external communication. The SFG Partner Survey asks partners to share their work focused on promoting the Protective Factors.

- Over 83% reported some type of promotion of SFG and Protective Factors
- 67% reported sharing SFG-related resources such as newsletters, emails, and websites
- 50% reported they developed their own SFG promotion resources and materials



SUPPORTING GEORGIA'S CAREGIVERS THROUGH PROTECTIVE FACTORS

Community Cafés: Learn with and from Other Caregivers

Community Cafés offer a place for caregivers to find support and connect with others.

Caregivers need people who understand and will listen, discuss problems, give meaningful advice, or simply to care.

2022 Community Café Highlights

- Created a new Community Café curriculum for in-person and virtual cafés
- Partnered with the Department of Public Health, Injury Prevention Program, to offer Community Cafés in counties experiencing high rates poor mental health
- Provided training to 100 facilitators at no charge
- Conducted needs assessment survey to improve the Café model implementation
